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Windmill Hole

Rock Climbing Guide





Legal Note: Climbing is very dangerous & always at your own risk. Nobody is forcing you to climb. You choose to climb, so choose to go home before the risks become too high. Remember even small injuries can take 6 weeks to heal. No responsibility for inaccurate or incomplete information will be accepted by the scribe or anybody else. The landowners accept no liability. Climbers take full responsibility for them at all times. Fixed protection will become unreliable, loose rock is common, solid rock becomes loose & RD writers make up most of the information, with a beer, at the computer. This RD is only a guide & is no substitute for experience, training, common sense & a touch of caution. So you are on your own...take care!

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Directions: Travel to the end of Western Ave over the N2. Turn right into Two Rivers Drive. Past Hemmingway Casino. Travel for 3.2km; turn L into Red Deer Way, L again into Snow Water Road, park at the big stump. Find a path that leads to the river. Follow the path along the river in an up stream direction for about 500m. The bush clears and the river can be seen. Further upstream are the crags. The first crag to the Lis *Bliksem Face*. *Millennium Wall* is above & to the L of the pool.

Walk-in: About 600m, 5 – 10 min, flat. Please take a machete to help keep the path clear.

Time & Weather: *Bliksem Buttress* remains shaded in summer for the whole day. *Millennium Wall* gets morning shade in summer. Can be cold in winter. The pool is great for swimming & rock jumping in on hot days.

Potential: There is always one more route. Even as late as 2014, two new lines were bolted. The trad lines on *The Millennium Wall* should be considered for retro bolting. Almost none have been repeated & the natural gear higher up is extremely skimpy.

General: 12 bolted routes and 13 easy, but run-out trad. Flat base & close to East London.

Rock Type: Mix of mud stone & silt stone. Vertical & quite smooth.

History: For decades Windmill Hole has been the hangout for rock jumpers & picnickers. The water below *Millennium Wall* is said to be 30m deep. The highest water jump is about 25m. In the early days before NSA was discovered & developed this was East London's main crag. These days NSA is frequented much more. *Bliksem* was first top roped in 1996 by Brad Murray & I. We set up the top rope & taught ourselves to climb. This was the start of a wave of route opening & the current climbing scene in East London. Till this point climbing in East London was completely unknown, there were no known climbers, no recorded routes & supposedly zero potential. It later turned out that Neil Briers had messed about on *Pompies Pillar*, Alan Briers had opened a line at *Yellow Sands* & Dave Freer had opened about 50 lines at *Morgan Bay*, but that was it. *Bliksem* became the first

sport line in East London. Garvin Jacobs & I carried in a hired generator lashed between two poles. The drill was also hired & we used a long extension cord from the generator to get to power to the drill. We were short of bolts so I fully bolted Bliksem & Garvin bolted The Crossing Guard. Then Garvin drilled *The Garden Route* & I drilled *Not The Millennium Route*. This was on my 26th birthday. We could only afford bolts & hangers for these routes a few months later. Next day we dashed to *Pompies Pillar* & drilled *Philippians 4:13*.

Hazards:

Loose Rock: There is a fair amount of loose rock that is still coming off the routes, as well as tons lying loose on top. Wear your helmet... it's a smart thing to do! Chicks dig helmets!

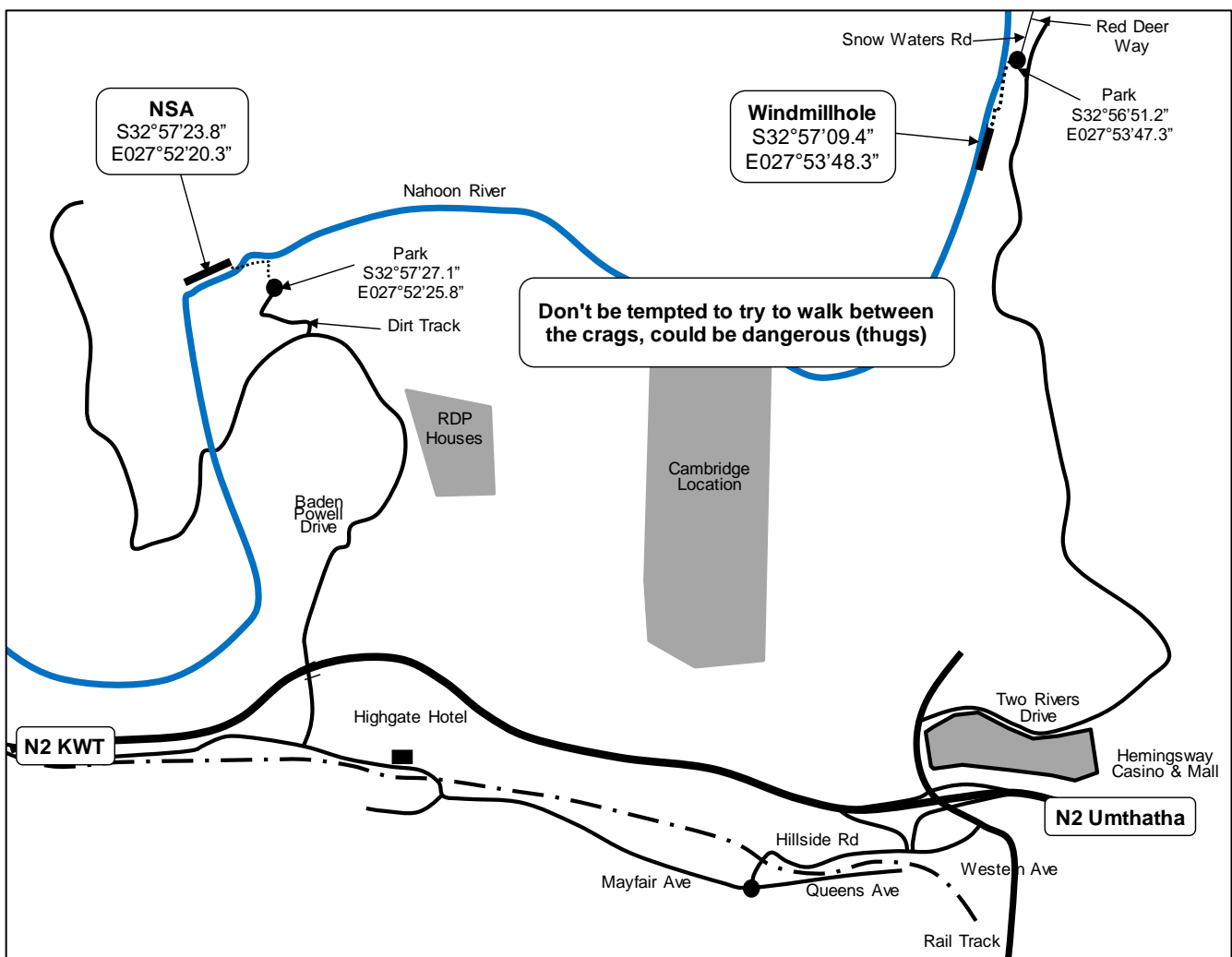
Crime: *Windmill Hole* has the potential to become a **crime** area. BEWARE! Nothing has occurred yet, but bush has squatters & others. No small parties or couples. Ja, a machete may come in handy for more than just the path. Take tear gas! Take care, especially if there are women in the party. Bigger groups are better.

Snakes: Puff adders have been spotted a few times. Watch your step.

Rock Jumping: There have been a number of fatalities. People slipping whilst jumping from the top and jumpers landing on swimmers. Police divers could not find the body of a child drowned in the pool. Be really careful. Always check the depth as rain may wash branches & other debris into the pool.

The **trad routes** are all easy, but the protection higher up is very poor. There is a fair amount of loose rock on the trad lines, as few of them have ever been repeated. The trad lines are not really worth repeating.

Access: This is municipal land. Free for all. Please don't make a noise in front of the houses at the Snow Water Road parking.

● **1. Ama Crimpo Crimpo – 24 ★★**

Morne van der Mescht & Derek Marshall 2001 (4B&C)

Bolted by Derek the Monster Marshall.

● **2. Bliksem – 22 ★★★**

Derek Marshall & Garvin Jacobs 1999 (4B&C)

Originally this route was attempted on trad gear by Alan Briers. He got to the top, but with quite a lot of dogging. Derek took a fall onto the ground from the crux, during a trad attempt with Ian Hatton.

● **3. Cool Bananas – 25 ★★**

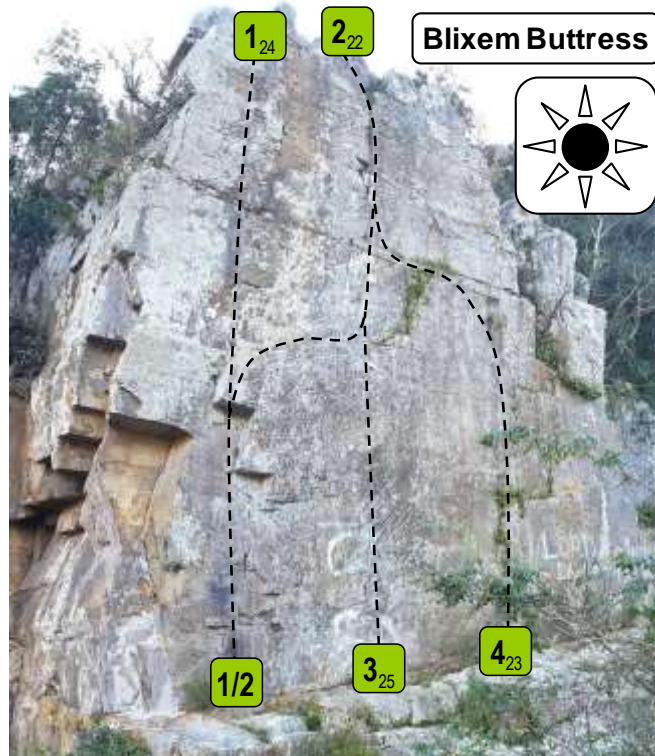

● **4. The Crossing Guard – 23 ★★**

Derek Marshall & Garvin Jacobs 1999 (4B&C)

Bolted by Garvin the very sweet awesome Jacobs.

1. The Wheel Turns – 17 ★

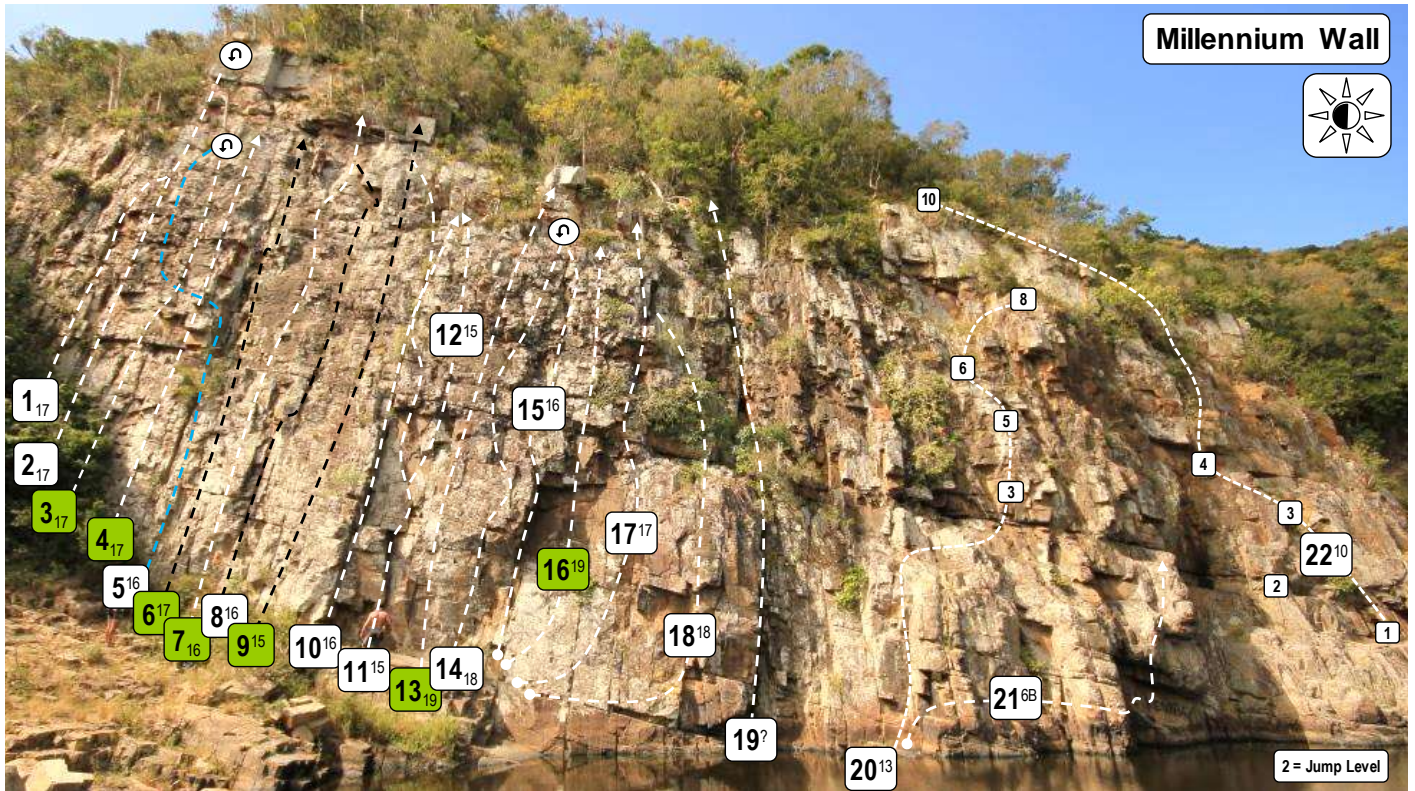
Derek Marshall & Allen Luck 2001 (T&C)

Start 2m R of chimney crack. Climb the open book, till it ends then move R onto easy ground. Chains are on the large block on the skyline.

2. When Friends are Few – 17

Derek Marshall & Kendyl Kunhardt 2001 (T&C)

Start on the LH arête of chimney. Through a small roof. Staying R of open book. Same chains as The Wheel Turns.



3. Crazy Bloody Mary – 17

Derek Marshall & Kendyl Kunhardt 2001 (9B&C)

Start 2m R of chimney. At small roof L to chains. Originally opened on natural protection. Bolted by Petr Pretorius.

4. Braai Vleis Vegter – 17 ★★

Derek & Caroline Marshall 30/03/2014 (10B&C)

5. Part of The Journey – 16

Derek Marshall & Heidi Smelders 07/01/2006 (T&C)

Start to the L of *Not the Millennium Route*. Move L into off width. Up the LH arête of crappy break. Traverse L to avoid loose rock, then move R to the chain, which are shared with *Crazy Bloody Mary*.

6. Procrastinate – 17 ★★

Derek & Caroline Marshall 29/03/2014 (9B&C)

7. Not the Millennium Route – 16 ★★

Derek Marshall & a pom called Chris 1998 (11B&C)

Follow the bolts. This was originally climbed on natural gear. Derek's first trad lead & first route opened.

8. More Marjoram – 16

Derek Marshall & Craig Bester 07/01/2006 (T&C)

Up break between *Not the Millennium Route* & *The Garden Route*. Stay between the bolts until moving L onto the last 2 bolts & chains of *Not the Millennium Route*.

9. The Garden Route – 15 ★★

Derek Marshall & Brad Murray 1999 (8B&C)

Follow the bolts. This was originally climbed on natural gear. Bolted by Garvin Jacobs.

10. Enemy Defeated – 16

Derek Marshall & William Lesley 07/01/2006 (T&C)

Up arête 1.5m R of *The Garden Route*. *Straight up*, staying R of bolts. Move L for last bolt & chains of *The Garden Route*.

11. Alpha Alpha Dogs of War – 15

Derek Marshall & a chick called Alison 1999 (T)

Start on block above water. Hand crack into open book. L into veg gully. Abseil off cactus.

12. Way Down in Never Land – 15

Derek Marshall & Ian Hatton 1999 (T)

Same start as Alpha Alpha Dogs of War. Move R and up to small open book. Abseil off cactus.

13. Byron's Bitter Blessing – 19 ★★

Garvin Jacobs & William Lesley 2010 (10B&C)



14. NATO Bombers – 18 ★★

Start in thin finger crack at edge of block. Through open “V” scoop. Abseil off twisted cactus.

Derek Marshall & Mie Elsen 2000 (T)

15. Blood of My Brother – 16

Step off block into small open book below roof. Up to open “V” scoop. Abseil off twisted cactus.

● **16. Steven’s Sweet Seventeen – 19 ★★**

Steven Reed & Derek Marshall 2001 (6B&C)

17. Justified – 17

Traverse R off block, then up thin crack to small roof. L to avoid roof. Abseil off cactus.

Derek Marshall & Kendyl Kunhardt 2000 (T)

18. Awesome Power of God – 18

Traverse R then up open book. Through veg to cactus.

Derek Marshall & Lundia Davies 2000 (T)

19. Bosbevok - ?

Obvious terrible looking break. Soloed by a madman on a bad day.

Wayne Bradley 1989 (S)

20. Jumpers Route - 13

This is the route used by rock jumpers with the various levels. ⚠ Take real care not to slip & to jump out far enough. Make sure you don’t land on anyone. Always check the water for under water debris. ⚠

21. Vagina Dinner – 6B

Deep water bouldering. Swim over, dry off, then traverse to below the large overhang. Pull directly through the overhang.

22. Jumpers Route - 11

This is the route used by rock jumpers with the various levels. ⚠ Take real care not to slip & to jump out far enough. Make sure you don’t land on anyone. Always check the water for under water debris. ⚠
