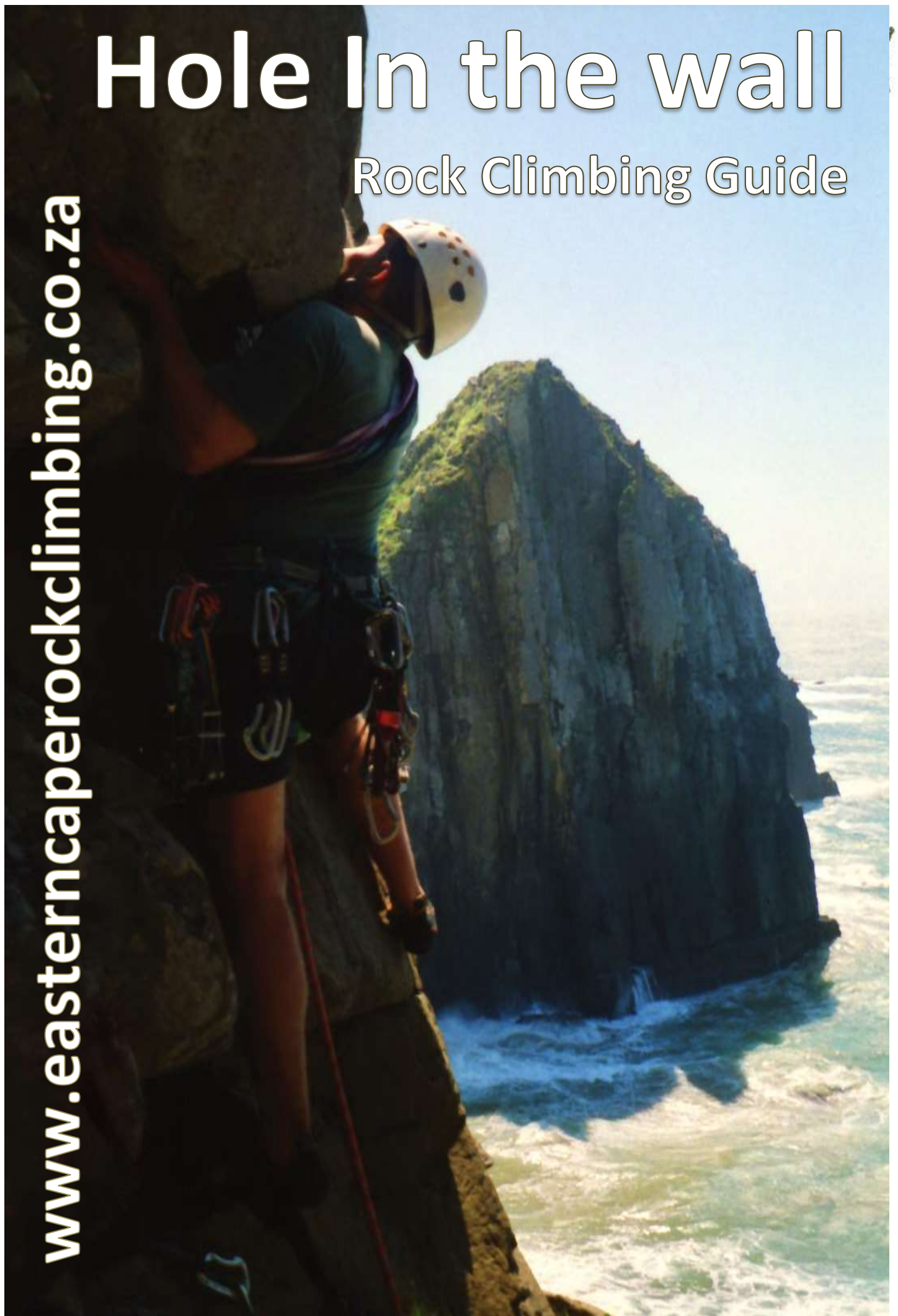


Hole In the wall

Directions: Find your way to Coffee Bay. Hole in the Wall is just south west of there. The road to Coffee Bay was tarred and quite good at the time of opening of routes.

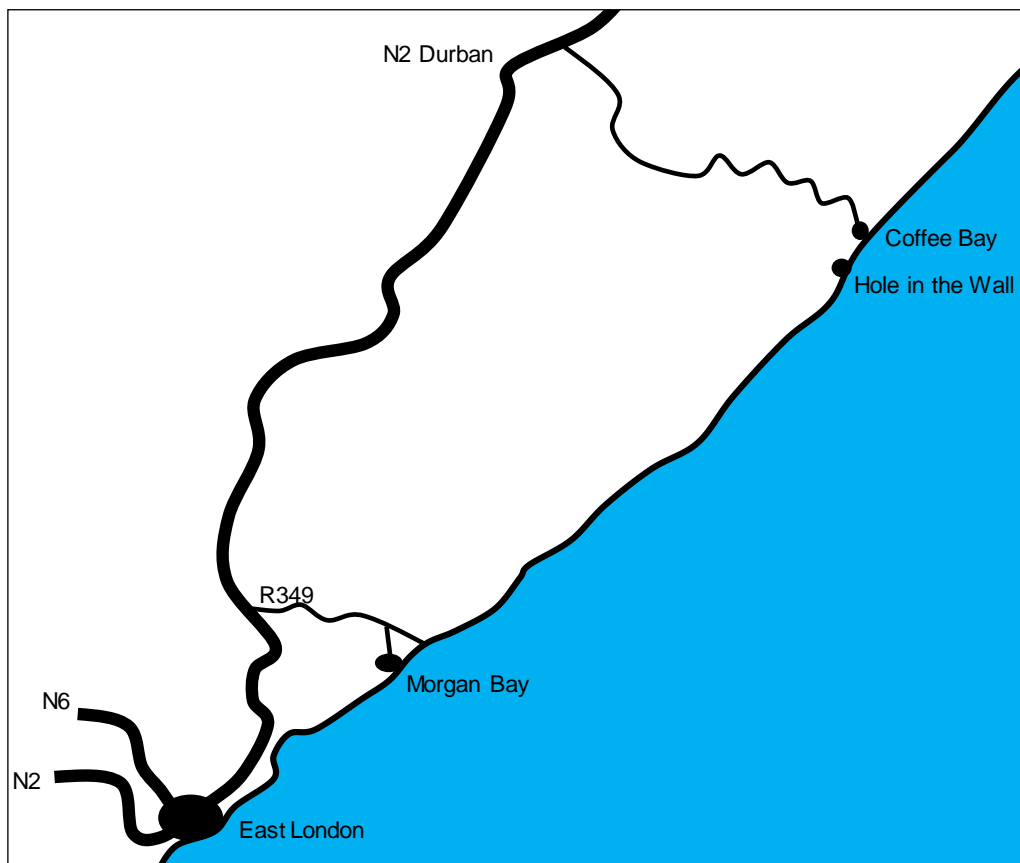
Accommodation: The best is to stay in the main hotel complex. They have cottages, bungalows & camping at reasonable rates. Crime is a concern. This complex will offer some security.

Tide: Access requires a serious wade in. Make sure you catch a low tide and be aware that you will be stuck on the island till the following low. Waterproof your bags.

Walk-in: Leave your vehicle in the hotel complex. Walk a few hundred meters to the beach across from *The Hole in the Wall*. Wade across the water to the landing which is on the LH side of the hole. Exit the water & start an easy, but rather dangerous scramble to the veg near the top. Lead on one rope slinging tufts, aloes, veg and shit. Belay up the second carrying the gear.

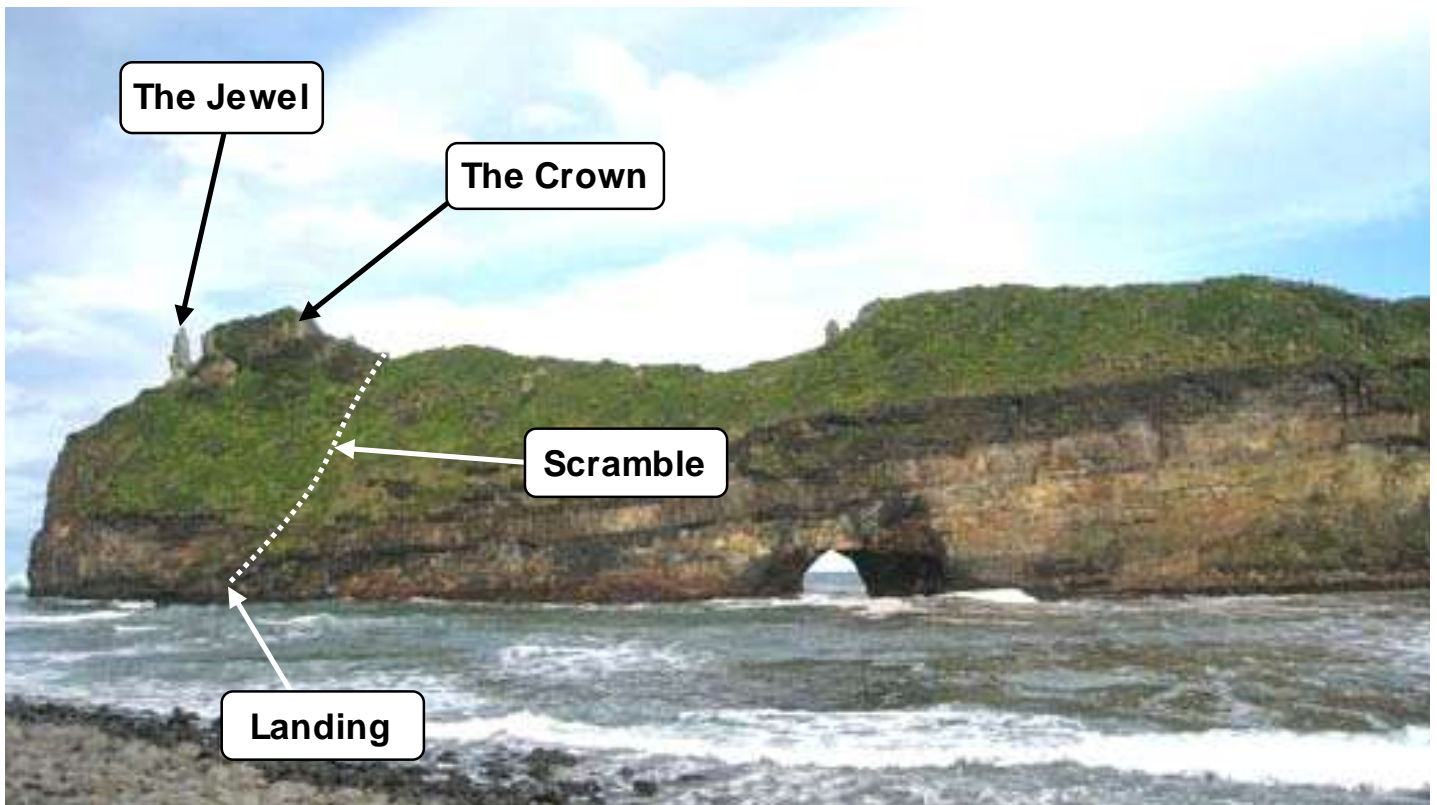

The Jewel

Find a sort of a path along the top in the direction of the free stander in the LH side. This will probably require a machete. The free stander is *The Jewel*. The rock is very loose and flaky and very short.

1. Cold Draft up Your Shaft – 20, A0

Derek Marshall & Allen Luck April 2002 (T&C)

Route starts under overhang on the seaside of pinnacle. Trend R onto slab. Grab chain halfway up. Top out. Single chain will bring you down.

2. Eating the After Birth – 14

Allen Luck & Derek Marshall April 2002 (T)

Opposite *The Jewel* in a small passage way. Up the prominent crack on the seaside.

The Crown

On the path along the ridge from *The Hole* to *The Jewel*, the path breaks L on the landward side. This small shaded out crop is *The Crown*. The routes are a tad short & quite crap. This is what you do while waiting for the tide to go out.

3. The Pigs Ear – 12

Up easy steps.

4. Sting – 11

Up face to the L of the prominent off width.

5. Living in the Hedge – 12

Derek Marshall & Allen Luck April 2002 (T)

Off width crack to the top.

6. Grave Reaper – 13

Allen Luck & Derek Marshall April 2002 (T)

To the R of the off width to the highest point.

The following route was climbed on the mainland in the impressive looking 'V' gully to the L of *The Hole in the Wall*. The rock is very poor. The route is on the RH wall of the gully, about 15m seaward of the start of the gully.

7. Crumble & Tumble – 17

Allen Luck & Derek Marshall April 2002 (T&C)

Up steps to broken open book. Trend to wards loose chimney till chains are found. This area is not recommended at all except for blasting to make concrete mix.
