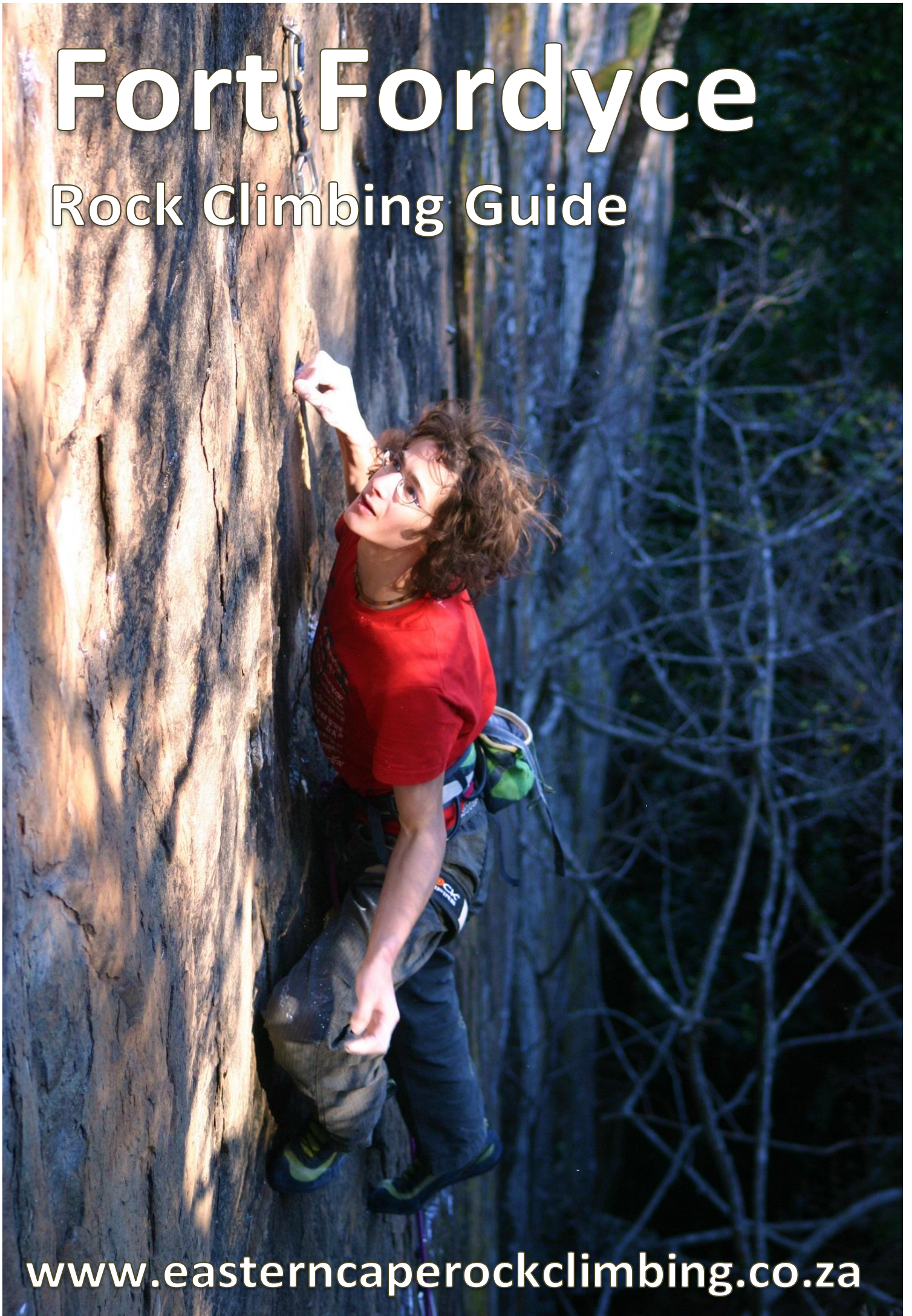


Fort Fordyce

Directions: From Fort Beaufort take the R67 towards Queenstown. About 13km from Fort Beaufort there is Baddaford farm stall. Baddaford has great lemon meringue, pies, various other yummy stuff & is recommended. 3km later there is a turn off to Fort Fordyce on the L. Follow the signs on a reasonable dirt road up a steep pass through a green forested hillside. Past the now defunct gate house. At the T junction turn L, continue to the office, various accommodation & living settlement at a junction at the top. Find the crags & accommodation from here.

Access: Fort Fordyce is a nature reserve & is open to the public. Reservations can be made at the Eastern Cape Parks Board reservations@ecparks.co.za or call 043-7054400.

To-do: Fort Fordyce has much to offer non-climbing family and many off day activities. Walking trails, swimming, bird watching & historical walks.

Accommodation: There is a range of accommodation available. Bush camping, bungalows & comfy cottages. Climbers normally camp at the dam or picnic area. The cottages are very comfortable, but mostly climbers like to camp. There are various camping places, please enquire at the office when you arrive.

General: There are 73 bolted routes with 10 projects & 69 trad lines. Beautiful forest & scenery.

Rock Type: Vertical dolerite set in thick bush. Lots of potential.

History: There is a host of recorded history regarding the battles between the Xhosas & European settlers & their various (Xhosa) allies. Please refer to these records for the official history. There are a number of great books on this subject, but Maqoma The Legend of a Great Xhosa Warrior by Timothy J Stapleton is highly recommended.

The first rock climb in Fort Fordyce was in the 1985. Keith James & George Kockott were driving to Grahamstown. George, an Eastern Cape local, wanted to show Keith, still a Vaalie at that stage, a fantastic forest. In those days Fordyce was a pine plantation. They walked through the pine plantation trees to the top of what became Labour Ward. Keith asked if anyone had climbed anything, ropes & gear were fetched & Keith abseiled down & cleaned Lactic Acid Trip. This was opened by Keith at 23. On a later trip in 1987 Eric Penman opened his classic lines *Birthday Crack*. The Rhodes University Mountain Club was active at

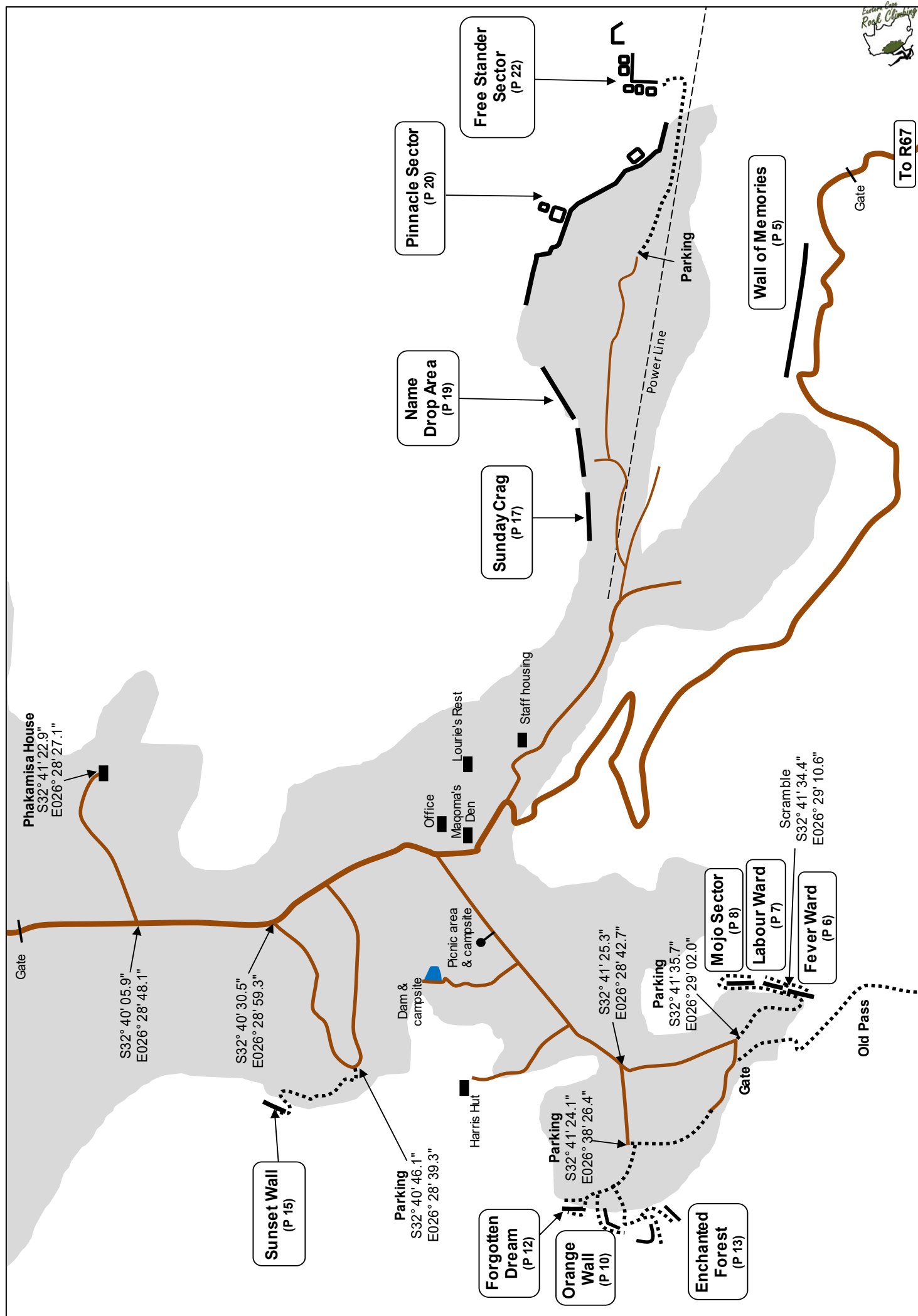


Keith James, the developer of many Eastern Cape climbing venues, bolted the first & majority of the sport lines & is responsible for the fresh wave of climbing at Fordyce. Keith managed to get European Union funding for the bolting & produced the first route guide for Fordyce. Later Garvin Jacobs added more sport lines. Derek Marshall climbed & recorded many of the trad routes.

The top climbers in South Africa & Adam Ondra, the current world champion made a brief appearance at Fordyce for the 2009 *Eastern Cape Rock 'n Road Trip*. *Orange Wall* was used for the red point event, *Flash for Cash*. Adam made short work of most of the projects laid on for his entertainment. He left behind two un-opened projects & a ground start to *Rocky*.

Wall of Memories



Halfway up the forested pass into Fort Fordyce, this crag is on well sign posted path, 10 minutes walk from the road.

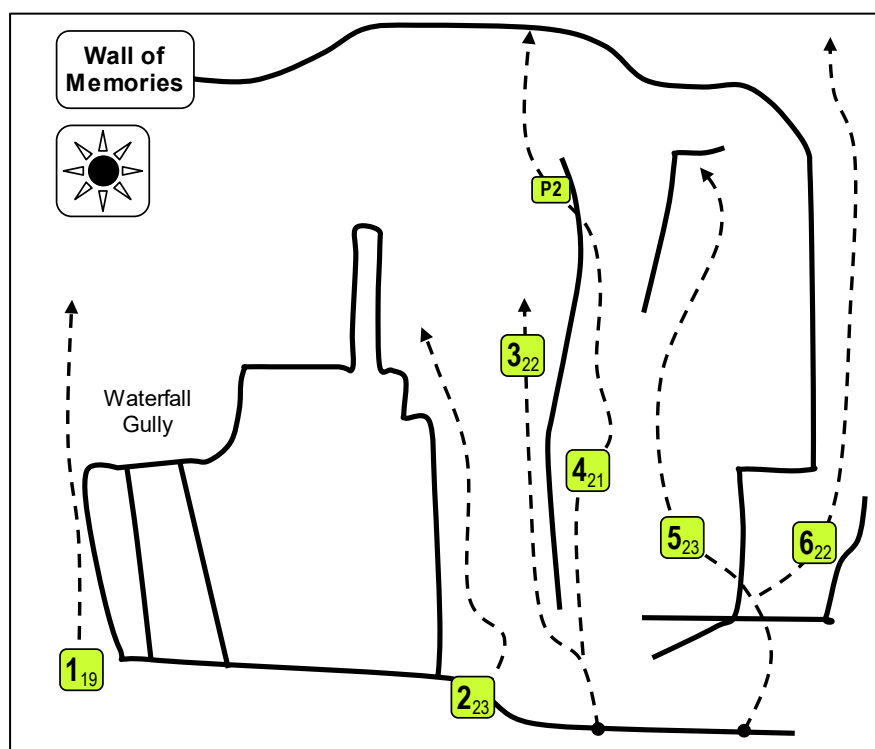

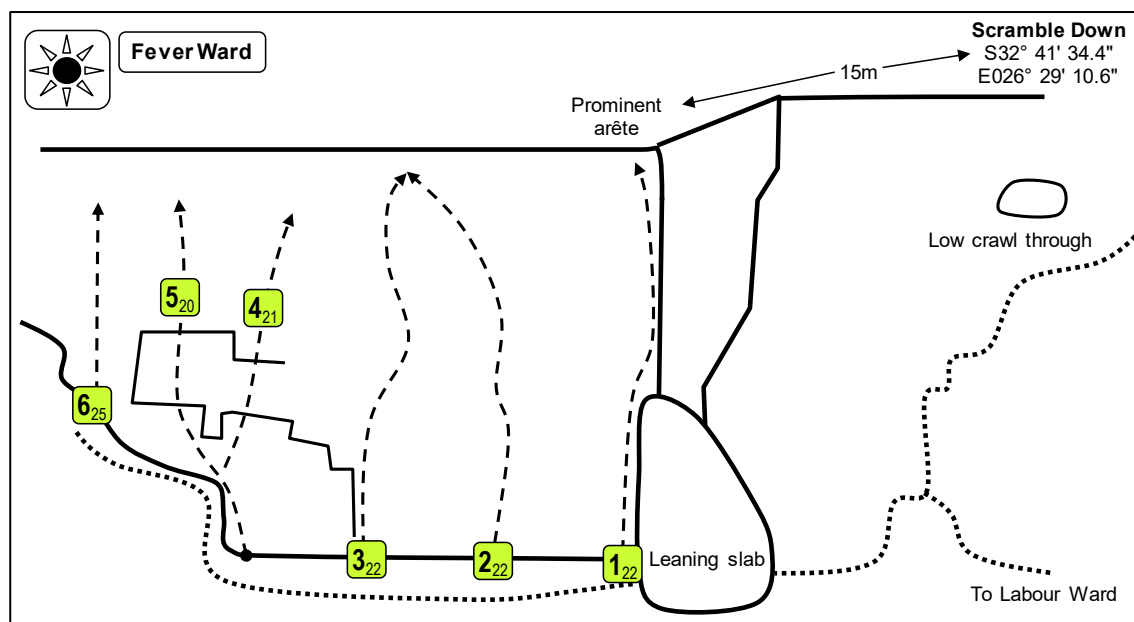


Fever Ward



As the road reaches the scattered settlement, where the office is situated, take a sharp L. Follow this road past the turn off to the campsite/dam & *Harris Hut*. The road continues through a short oak avenue. 500m further. Keep L & park at some flat slabs. Look out for beacons that lead to a path. After about 200m make a turn L on to another path. Continue on this through a thick alien veg patch to where the path breaks out on top of the *Fever Ward*. Find the scramble down 15m from the prominent *Jungle Fever Arête*. Scramble is easier than it looks.

Walk-in as for *Fever Ward*. Move about 30m R to the *Labour Ward*.

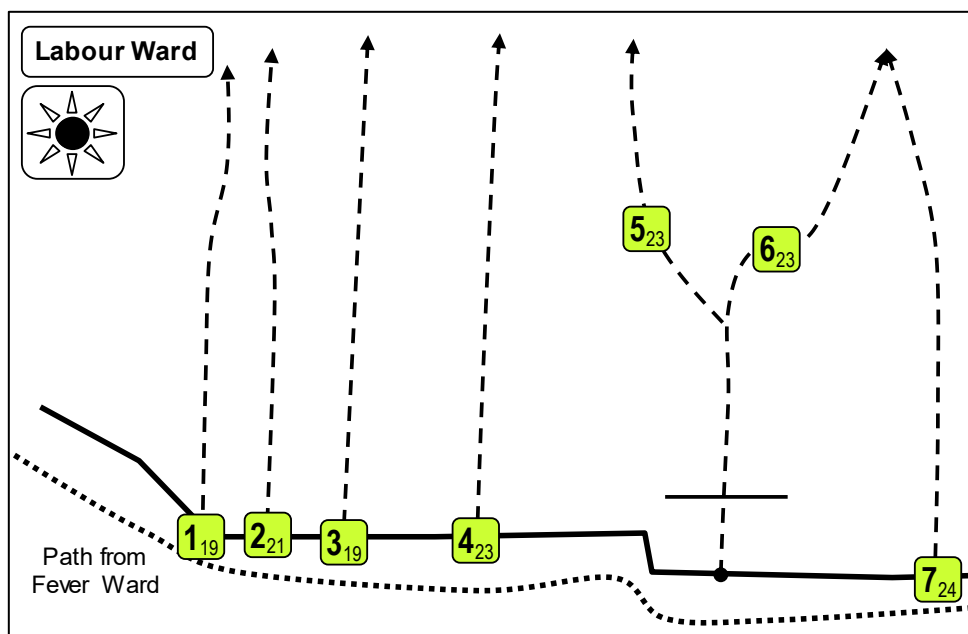

Park & walk-in as for *Fever Ward*. Continue across the top of the crag to a scramble down or walk 15m further to a walk-in.

Crack up ramp & steps that is closest to the scramble down.

2. Woe to the Vanquished – 17

Up stepped crack into groove crack. Move R where the crack blanks. Continue up clipping the top 3 bolts of *Yojo Edging*.

3. Yojo Edging – 19 ★

Start on belay anchors on ramp above path. Move immediately L, then up. Higher up traverse R & up the RH arête.

4. Afraid to Shoot Strangers – 16

Up short ramp, past the belay anchors & first bolt of *Yojo Edging*. Directly up crack.

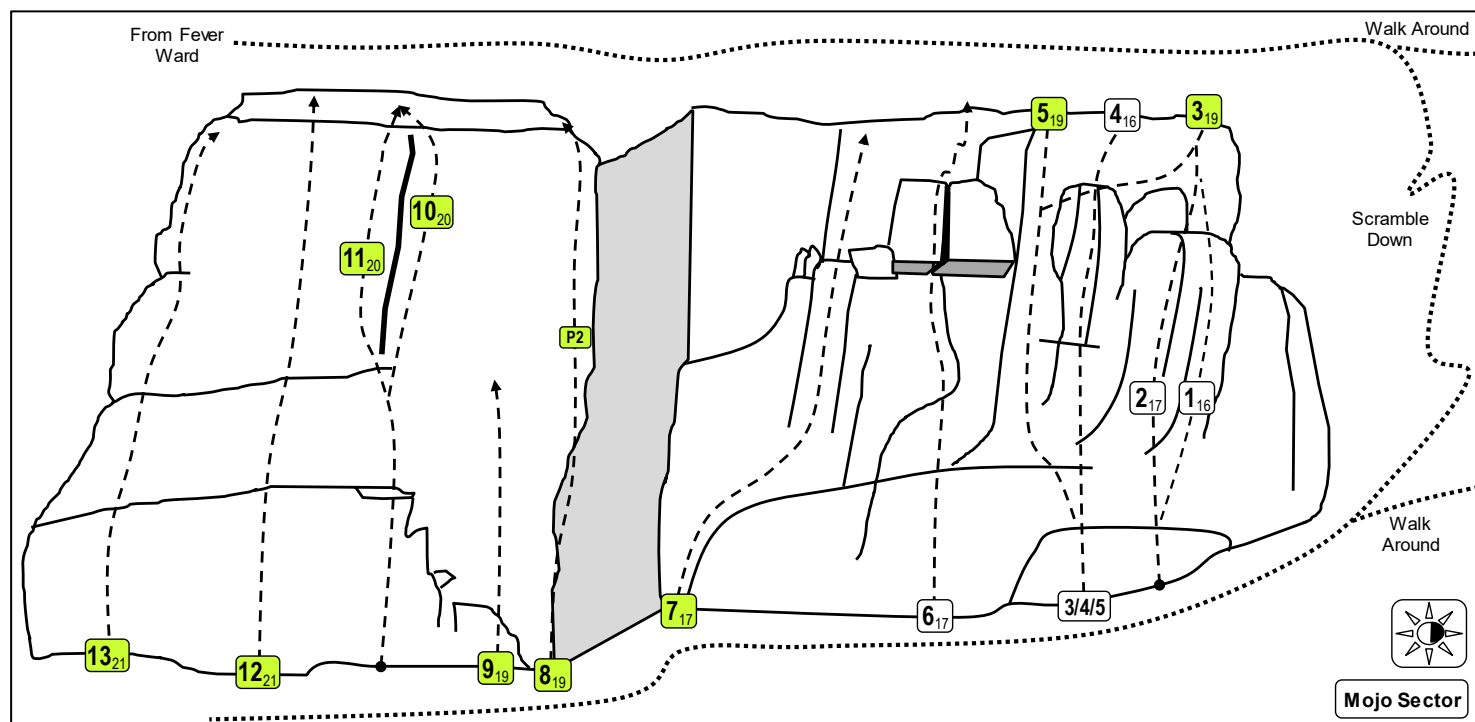

Up prominent ramp finger crack onto a ledge. Continue up staggered finger cracks to the prominent fist crack between two giant loose blocks. From the top of the blocks, up stepping R.

Orange Wall



As the road reaches the scattered settlement, take a sharp L. Follow this road past the turn off to the camp site/dam & *Harris Hut*. Just after the first section of oak trees that line the road, turn R. Park 350m further. Follow a good path for 75m, then turn R. Walk 300m to above the second clump of trees. Turn L (S32° 41' 24.0" E026° 28' 33.1"). Down over clean slabs to the tree line. The path into the forest starts to the R of the fence (S32° 41' 23.9" E026° 28' 29.2"). Once in the forest follow the path L to the *Orange Wall*.

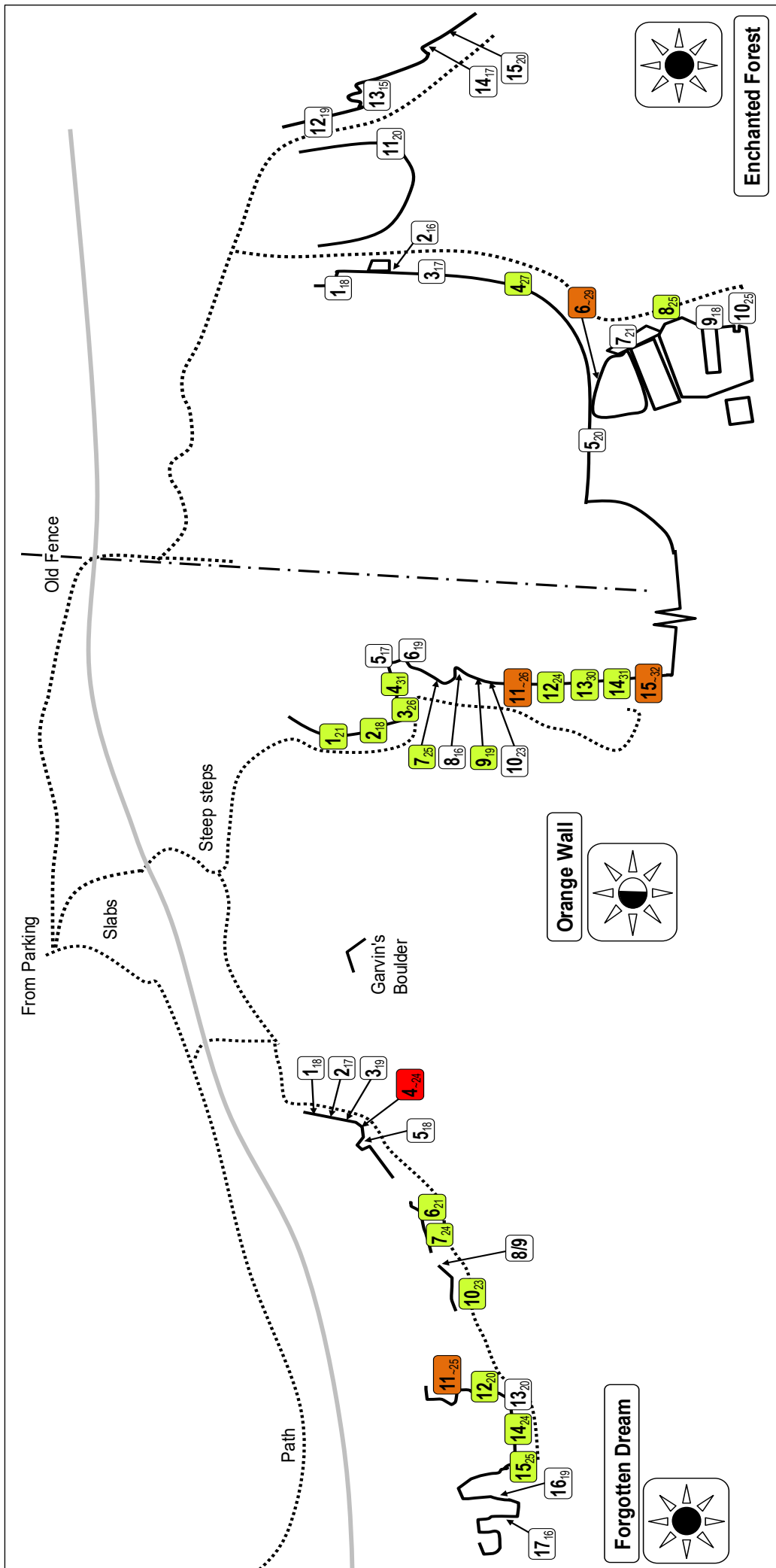

From the same parking & walk-in as for *Orange Wall*. In the forest at the base of the small faces move R for 250m, away from *Orange Wall*.

Start above horrible anal rape spike (☠ Beware!). Step L on ledge, up off-width, over boulder, move R & top out.

2. Cry of Silence – 17 ★

Derek & Juan-drax Marshall 04/06/2017 (T)

Start 9m R of *Grade Wars*, up off-width onto ledges. Up awesome L trending curved crack.

3. Silent Winter – 19 ★★

20m Derek & Juan-drax Marshall 04/06/2017 (T)

Start 5m R of *Grade Wars*, up off-width.

4. Grade Wars - Closed Project ~ 24

Bolted Garvin Jacobs (8B&C)

5. A Phantom Dissonance – 18

Derek & Juan-drax Marshall 04/06/2017 (T)

Start 1m L of *Grade Wars*, up off-width groove that curves R near the top. Past the chains, top out.

6. Stage Fight – 21 ★

8. The Apostasy Canticle - 14

20m Derek Marshall & Terence Trevaskis 04/06/2017 (T)

Start about 8m R of *I Fink U Freeky*, up a nice RH layaway crack, onto a ledge. Move R over easy ground into a cubby hole ledge, up nice crack on RHS.

9. A Scenery of Loss – 16

18m Derek Marshall & Terence Trevaskis 04/06/2017 (T)

Same start as *The Apostasy Canticle*. Step L past a veg crack to a nice hand fist crack.

10. I Fink U Freeky – 23 ★★

11. Open Project ~ 25

Bolted by Juan-drax Marshall (9B&C)

12. Reconciliation – 20 ★★

Up vegged recess into prominent off-width behind the huge free-standing flake. Up over exposed bald bulge.

15. Collective Unconsciousness – 25 ★★

16. Iron Man – 19 ★

To the L of *Collective Unconsciousness*, up a perfect crack line with a ledge in the middle.

17. Fanny Man – 16

Derek & Juan-drax Marshall 31/08/2013 (T)

Climb the crack on the other side of the fin to *Iron Man*. It ends in a finger crack with loose blocks, so rail R into an easier option.

Enchanted Forest



From the same parking & walk-in as for *Orange Wall*, but before the path gets close to the tree line, walk up to an old fence line. Only the posts remain. Follow the posts into the forest. 15m into the forest find a cairned path to the L, follow this for about 30m to a point where it junctions with two easy walk down gullies. Choose either & descend into *Enchanted Forest*.

Up diagonal R trending ramp into L facing open book fist crack, into off-width break, out onto ledge to the L.

L facing open book fist crack, stepping L into L layaway crack. Follow this to a ledge above. Up the small face on L of ledge.

3. Plan Within a Plan – 17 ★

30m Derek Marshall & Dave Harding 27/04/2015 (T)

Perfect hand-fist crack groove that widens into an off-width on occasions.

4. Devil's Whiskey – 27 ★★

Aurélien Hees & Derek Marshall 24/08/2014 (9B&C)

5. Panzerschreck – 20 ★★★

32m Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 20/01/2015 (T)

Startup perfect hand fist crack. Directly up, where it blanks, step R, then back L on the ledge above. Continue up easy groove above.

6. Open Project ~ 29

7. Hoi Polloi – 20, A0

16m Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 16/08/2015 (T)

Start in chimney passageway below huge scary jammed boulder slab. Up onto the slab, then into a short but sever slightly overhanging off-width.

8. Homo-cidal Nightmare - 25 ★

Bolted by Derek Marshall.

9. Vuurgereed – 18

26m Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 16/08/2015 (T)

Up a fist crack to gain a gully-passageway with a large tree on the L. Go into the gully & climb the stunning fist crack in the LH side. This trends L to the top out. Exit by traversing R to the chains of 8.

10. Ma sê Foken Tjops! - 25 ★★★

Juan-dray & Derek Marshall 27/04/2015 (T)

Up the prominent off-width, then step R into an overhanging off-width. Fight...for your life... through the overhang, then continue up to the top, without gear. The 2nd could only get up with lots of tight rope & by pulling on gear. There are no moves & its f***en desperate even seconding. Ideally you need 2-3 size 6 cams for the 2nd to pull on.

11. Tikhvin – 20

32m Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 01/06/2015 (T)

Up the first fist crack, into an off-width & onto some precarious blocks. Up off-width to a flack crack that runs L. Onto a ledge & through the chimney to the other side. Up the chimney on the other side to the top of the free stander.

12. Protean – 19

7m Derek & Caroline Marshall 28/06/2014 (T)

Start in wide recess into stunning R trending diagonal finger crack traverse. Mantle onto ledge & up to the top out.

13. Force Multiplier – 15

9m Derek & Caroline Marshall 28/06/2014 (T)

Up LH off-width open book, into passage to top out.

14. Voor Sprong Aanvalk – 17

15m Derek & Caroline Marshall 28/06/2014 (T)

Off-width open book into finger crack stepped open book. At the top move L into fist crack.

15. Mobility Wins – 20

16m Derek & Caroline Marshall 28/06/2014 (T)

3m R of *Voor Sprong Aanvalk*, up steps to flack crack, then thin mantle to top out.



Sunset Wall



This is the recommended beginners to intermediate crag. Set in gorgeous leafy forest, this is the recommended sunny day or cold winter afternoon crag.

On the road that leads through Fort Fordyce, about 350m after the office, take a sharp L turn. Take the 2nd road of the “crescent”, as the one closest to the office is muddy & grown over. Basically the one closest to the office is fine if it's your old 4X4 or a government 4X4. Follow the 2nd road to where a walking trail starts. The path to *Sunset Wall* starts about 15m R of the sign for the walking trail. Follow the weak path for 300m towards a high fence on clean slabs. Through the fence. Trend R to lower slabs. The path continues at the tree line to the L of the lower slabs. Once in the forest move steeply down & R to the *Sunset Wall*.

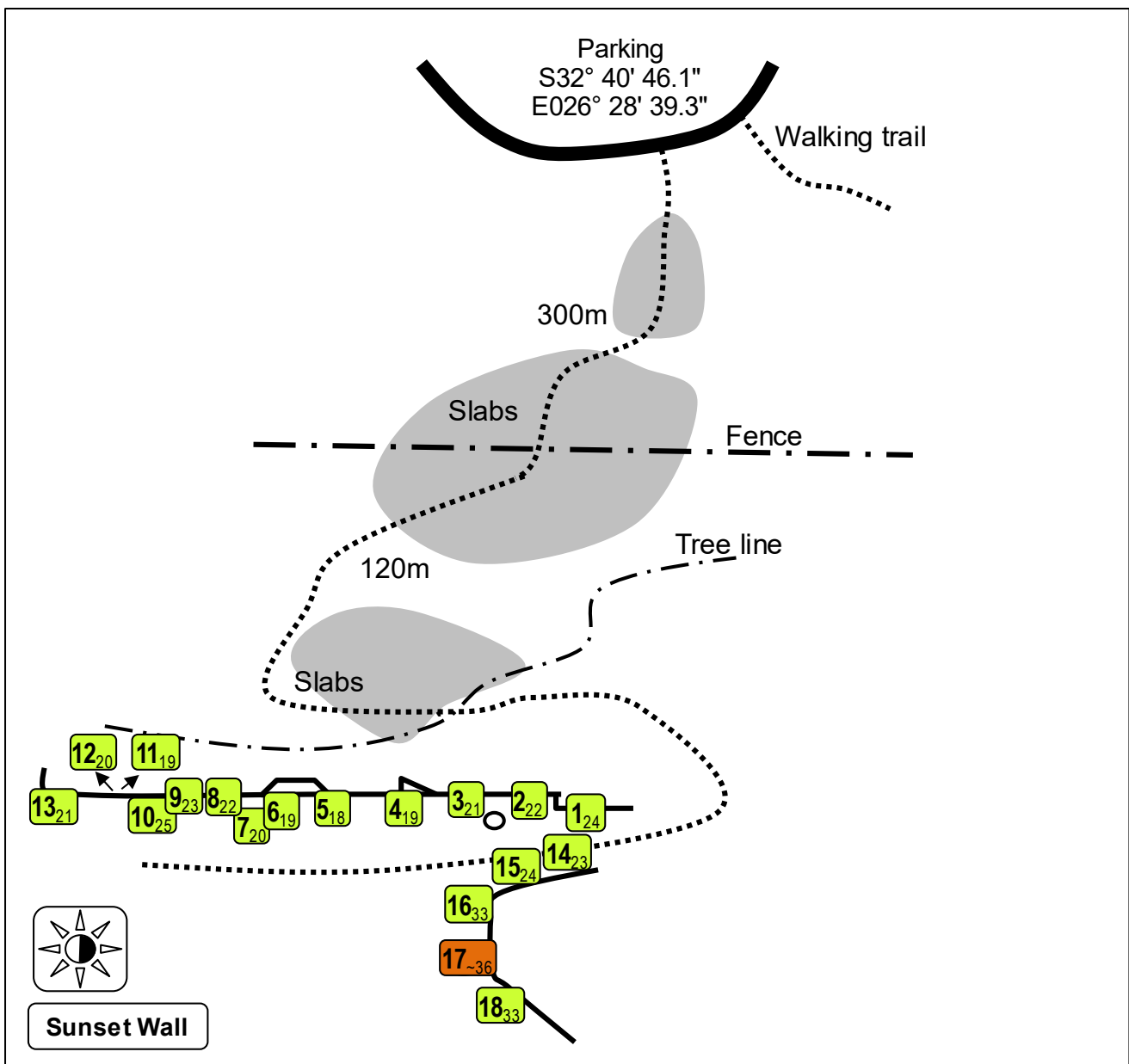

Adam said this was "9a at least, maybe 9b or 9c. Very hard block." He said it goes, but he needs 6 days to work it. This was the only route on his South African trip that he got onto; worked & walked away empty handed. So there you have it...nasty hard!

● 18. Rocky – 33 ★★★

Bolted by Garvin Jacobs & Kevin Watkins. There is a perceived ground start to this route. Adam started a few meters up from where you can clip the first bolt. He said it would take some time to work out the moves for the ground start.





Sunday Crag



At the first T junction turn R follow the road past the gate to the staff village. Take the LH option at the next Y junction, about 200m further, take a track L. Follow the track within sight of a long straight power line. After about 1km the track branches north or down into a big dip. Take the northern option & park a few 100m from the edge of the escarpment (hard to describe). 400m walk slightly down hill & towards the office northerly will take you to the rocky edge. Find the distinct buttress separated by a deep chimney. There are abseil bolts on top. Find your way down the chimney to a ramp shelf.

Perfect R facing curved open book.

2. Contested Legacy – 21 ★★

Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 21/07/2013 (T)

Start 6m L of (3), up sharp strange open book with a violent looking spike jammed in the crack about 5m up. Move L out of the roof and up the off-width. Step R into a R facing ramp open book.

4. Face Book Anties – 21

Open book off-width cave, enter the base & climb inside, through the orifice at the top. Not for fatties.

5. Shelter Me – 18 ★★

Derek Marshall & Craig Bester Sept 2008 (T)

Perfect layback crack to L of The Real Me.

● 6. Open Project ~ 27

Garvin Jacobs & Stefan Buys Sept 2008 (6B&C)

9. Injury to One is an Injury to One - 21 ★★

Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 20/07/2013 (T)

Startup overhanging crack onto ledge & then into wide open book flake system.

10. Berlin – 19 ★★

Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 20/07/2013 (T)

Off-width crack.

11. Auntie sê Kraak - 22

Juan-drax Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 01/09/2013 (T)

Up off-width to on top of the block in the crack, enter into the cavern. Climb the off-width on the inside of the cavern.

12. Player – 20

Juan-drax Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 01/09/2013 (T)

Start on the ramp block with the huge cabbage tree. L into open book off-width, up to a ledge on the R, continue up off-width behind.

13. Veggie Bugger – 18 ★★

Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 25/08/2013 (T)

Perfect hand crack start, into L traverse, up layback arête & into chimney.

14. Freak a Bean – 20 ★

Juan-drax Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 01/09/2013 (T)

Up 'V' recess, pull through roof. Move up easy ground to the R to belay from tree.

15. Hurricane – 16

Derek Marshall & Che Freese 01/08/2013 (T)

Off-width into easy scramble.

16. Nanjing – 20 ★★

Derek Marshall & Che Freese 01/08/2013 (T)

Under cut off-width, to a large tree. Easy ground to the top.

17. Dricus the Veggie Bastard – 18 ★★

Derek Marshall & Dricus Bezuidenhout 25/08/2013 (T)

Undercut off-width start, up crack on L of blunt arête.

18. Hail Hale Berry's Cherry – 17

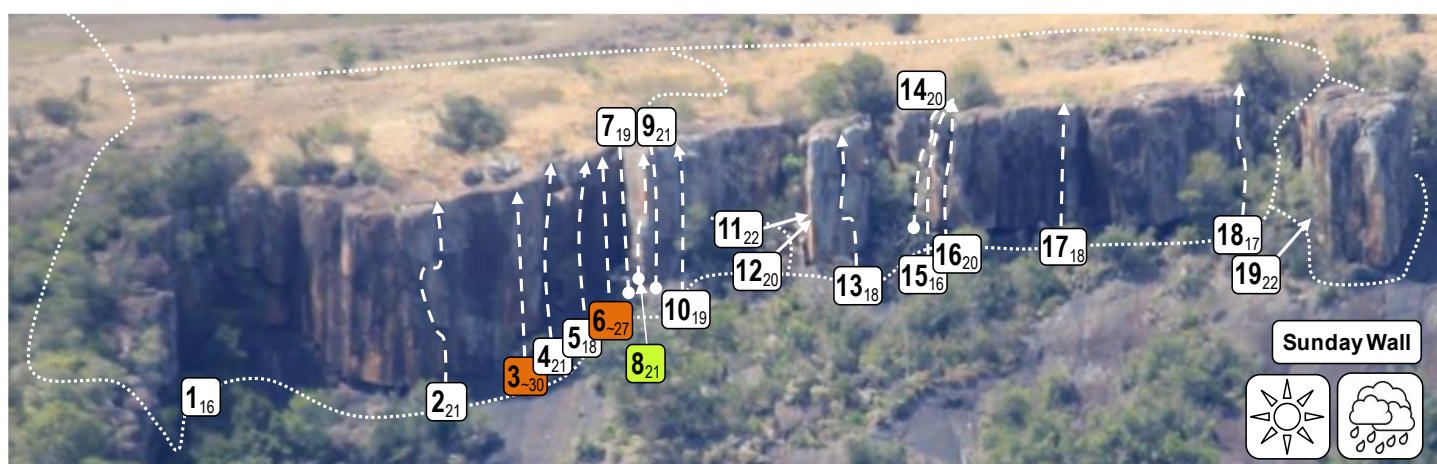

3. Tunnel of Fun - 14

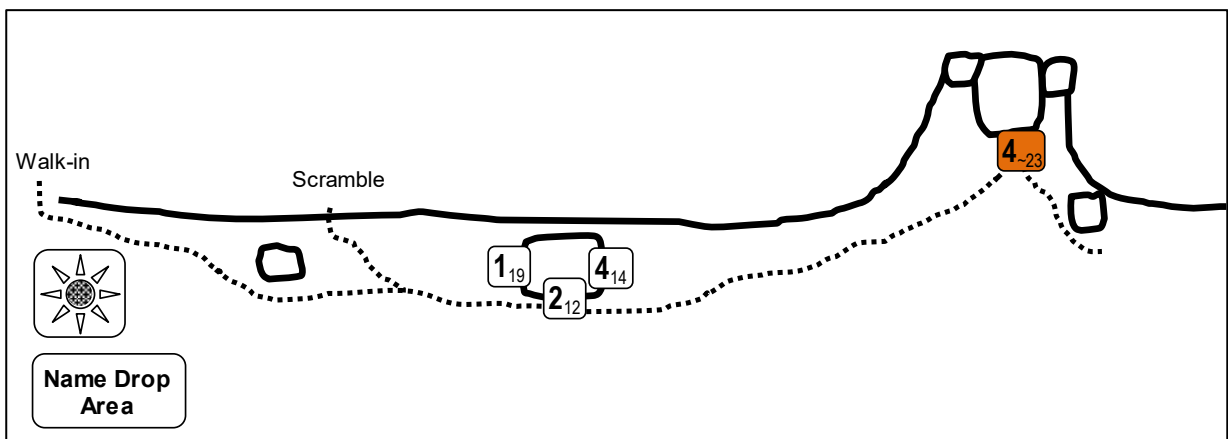

AKA Throwing Two 2kg Packets of Viennas Down A Passage

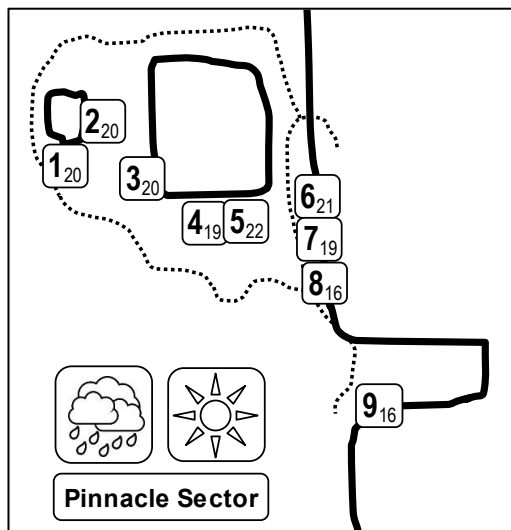
Up the chimney on the western side of the stack.

Off-width.



Pinnacle Sector



This is a super wow pinnacle about 500m east of *Sunday Crag*. It is well worth the effort. Plenty of potential.

1. Platinum Label – 20 ★★★

40m James Matcher, Bruce Davidson, Frans & Rhodes University Mountain Club crew 1991 (T&C)

Fist & hand crack on the LH side. Original descent was from a hex abseil point on the summit.

2. Vae Vuctis – 20

Garvin Jacobs & Mark Horan 2010 (T)

Takes a prominent break in the gully face of the pinnacle. Route finishes in a balls-y off-width cubby hole. Abseil off the wedged tat.



3. Dubious Levitation – 20 ★★★

Mark Mannheim & Melissa Cardoso 03/06/2018 (T)

Up crack to R of gully.

4. Fig Finger – 19

Mark Mannheim & Melissa Cardoso 03/06/2018 (T)

Up the nice-looking crack to a ledge. Across the ledge & up to abseil tree.

5. Soriavo – 22 ★

24m Derek Marshall & Mark Mannheim 27/05/2018 (T)

Up mean off-width, onto veg ledge. Up chimney to the top.

6. Brass Balls in the Dappled Light – 21 ★★

Mark Mannheim & Derek Marshall 27/05/2018 (T)

Up off-width.

7. Black & White Illusion – 19 ★★

Mark Mannheim & Derek Marshall 27/05/2018 (T)

Same start as *We Shall Never Die*. Break out L early. Up off-width.

8. We Shall Never Die – 16

Derek Marshall & Mark Mannheim 27/05/2018 (T)

Up short off-width.

9. Light of the Northern Star – 16

Derek Marshall & Mark Mannheim 27/05/2018 (T)

Up behind flake that forms an off-width layaway crack.

About 150m east of the pinnacle is a small crag.

10. Luck - 23 ★★★

20m Derek Marshall & Terence Trevaskis 16/07/2022 (T&C)

Perfect crack! Interesting crack to the top. Rail R & up to chains.

11. Absolution – 20

22m Derek Marshall & Terence Trevaskis 06/07/2019 (T)

1.5m L of the prominent crack with top anchors. Up small recess, into 'V' slot & onto ledge. Up open book with giant loose flakes, up tree roots & veg.

Free Stander Sector



At the first T junction turn R follow the road past the gate to the staff village. Take the LH option at the next Y junction, about 200m further, take a track L. Follow the track within sight of a long straight power line. After about 1km the track branches north or down into a big dip. Take the track into the dip. Continue driving about 300m past the dip till the track peters out. Park. Walk following the power line for about 600m. The power line goes into a series of small dips, as you reach the top of the small rise if the last, follow a bit of a path into a thicket. There is a steep but easy walk down to the base of the first 3 free standing pillars.

1. Vision Thing – 18 ★

15m Derek & Juan-dray Marshall 16/05/2015 (T)

Step off block into a horizontal crack. Up nice hand crack into a thin finger crack, over a loose flake, then onto RH arête.

2. By Any Means Necessary – 18

Derek Marshall & Terence Trevaskis 16/05/2015 (T)

On the freestanding stack closest to the landmass, up the off-width in-between the 1st & 2nd free standers. Onto a ledge, then L & up to a chimney, past the chimney, up & round the corner. Up the crack formed by a loose pillar block. This means you will have traversed 180° to the opposite corner, is risky & kak...don't repeat! To get off the top, lower one climber then abseils off the opposite side.

3. Dragon Lies Bleeding – 17 ★

Derek & Juan-dray Marshall 16/05/2015 (T)

Up ramp to gain curving fist crack, up past nice tree to the top of the 2nd free stander.

4. Never Run – 15

Derek & Juan-dray Marshall 17/05/2015 (T)

Up chimney, over chock stones to gain a gully passage. Move R in the passage to the ramp groove to top of the 3rd free stander.

5. We are Many – 21

Juan-dray & Derek Marshall 17/05/2015 (T)

Up L trending fist crack, onto a ledge, move R to smooth curved off-width. Onto a ledge, past a huge tree, up V groove to top of 3rd free stander.

6. Into the Battle – 23 ★★

22m Juan-dray & Derek Marshall 16/05/2015 (T)

Up L facing open book, into L trending roof off-width under cling crack. Up into a cubbyhole below an overhanging off-width. Up this with some strain to a hand crack to the top.

7. Fire Ready – 17

Juan-dray & Derek Marshall 16/05/2015 (T)

P1 – 15 17m Up easy steps past a huge jammed boulder. Easy ground to a huge natural arch that looks like a huge elephant hind leg.

P2 – 17 20m Up chimney to the R, over chock stones, move L into grove, then to the top.

8. Relentless Pursuit – 16

15m Derek & Juan-dray Marshall 17/05/2015 (T)

Fist & off-width, moving R & up back of small free-standing block. Belay from the bollard on top. Easy scramble off.

9. River of Steel – 17

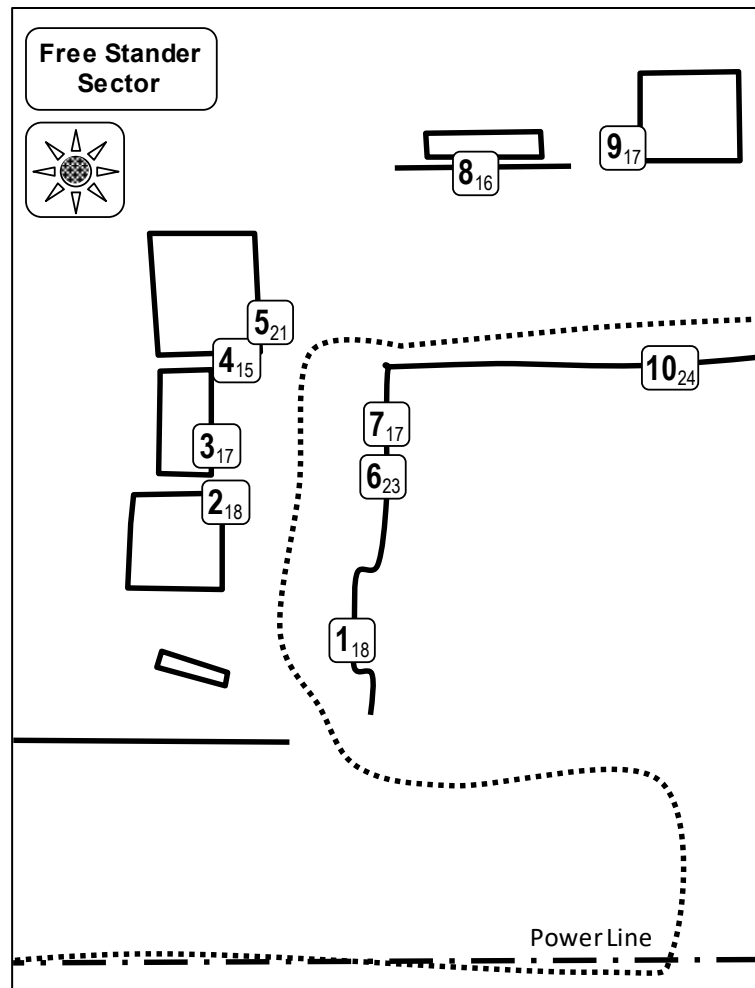
18m Derek & Juan-dray Marshall 17/05/2015 (T)

Hand & fist crack on the office side of free stander. Off-width near the top. Abseil off tat on top.

10 Iron Law – 24 ★

18m Juan-dray & Derek Marshall 17/05/2015 (T)

Monstrous off-width. Ledgy bits in-between. Freaking hectic & dangerous.
